A number of years ago researchers performed an experiment
to see the affect hope has on those undergoing hardship. Two
sets of laboratory rats were placed in separate tubs of water.
The researchers left one set in the water, and found that
within an hour they had all drowned. The other rats were
periodically lifted out of the water and then returned. When
that happened, the second set of rats swam for over 24 hours.
Why? Not because they were given a rest, but because they
suddenly had hope! Those animals somehow hoped that if
they could stay afloat just a little longer, someone would
reach down and rescue them. If hope holds such power for
rodents, how much greater should its effect be on our lives.
