We cannot grasp the true meaning of the divine holiness by thinking of someone or something very pure and then raising the concept to the highest degree we are capable of. God's holiness is not simply the best we know infinitely bettered. We know nothing like the divine holiness. It stands apart, unique, unapproachable, incomprehensible and unattainable. The natural man is blind to it. He may fear God's power and admire God's wisdom, but His holiness he cannot even imagine. *A. W. Tozer*

Holy can be defined as "separate," "set apart," "distinct," or "uncontaminated." In reference to God, "holy" means that He is different from us. None of His attributes can be understood by comparison to his creatures... Holiness is not one of many attributes of God. It is his essential nature and seen in all His qualities. *Edward Welch*

As used in Scripture, holiness describes both the majesty of God and the purity and moral perfection of His nature. Holiness is one of His attributes; that is, holiness is an essential part of the nature of God. His holiness is as necessary as His existence, or as necessary, for example, as His wisdom or omniscience.
